Preparing for 1/13/19

From what you see here (as well as in the earlier chapters of Jeremiah) how would you describe the nature and personality of God's people? From God's perspective, what characteristic of his people are most significant?

God says to his people in 7:3 "reform your ways and your actions". From what you observe in these chapters, what did this reforming need to involve?

How does 8:7-17 reveal the intensity of the people's sins?

From what you see in these chapters, what are the most significant consequences for Israel's sins?

What do you see as the particular significance of 9:23-24, both for God's people in Jeremiah's day, and for believers today?

Chapter 6 intensifies the picture of God's rejection of his people. What are the most important truths they need to understand about this rejection?

What would you select is the key verse or passage in Jeremiah 5-10 -- one that best captures or reflects the dynamics of what these chapters are all about?

The Lord tells his people in chapter 6:16 how to "find rest for your souls". Explore this phrase as Jesus used it in Matthew 11:25-30. How does this new testament context expand the full biblical meaning of this phrase?
